10. INFORMATION FOR VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT: Eligible votes have 2 ways to cast ballots prior to Election Day: Absentee by Mail and Advance (Early) Voting

ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL

Eligible voters desiring to vote by mail may do so WITHOUT PROVIDING A REASON OR IDENTIFICATION. However, voters who registered for the first time in Georgia by mail and did not provide identification, will be required to provide at the time of voting, one of the six acceptable forms of PHOTO ID listed on page 3 or a copy of current utility bill, blank statement, government check, paycheck or other governmental document that shows the name and address of the voter. **Those voters not having the proper form of identification will be offered a Provisional Ballot.**

ABSENTEE BALLOTS WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR MAIL ON MONDAY, OCTOBER 12, 2015

Voters may request an Absentee Ballot by mail beginning 180 days prior to any election. However, the last day an Absentee Ballot can be mailed is Friday, October 30, 2015

WHAT TO INCLUDE IN THE BY-MAIL ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUEST

Voters may mail or fax a written request for an Absentee Ballot. The written request should include:

- Name and address as registered to vote
- Date of birth
- Election name and date (i.e. Special Election...ESPLOST – 11/3/2015)
- Address where ballot is to be mailed
- Daytime contact or phone number
- Voter's signature

WHERE TO SEND THE ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUEST

The Absentee Ballot request should be sent to:

Voters may also contact our office to have an Absentee Ballot Application mailed or faxed to them.

ACCEPTABLE PHOTO IDENTIFICATION FOR VOTING

Acceptable forms of **Photo Identification** are:

1. A Georgia Driver's License (even if expired or suspended);
2. Valid State or Federal Government photo ID;
3. Valid US Passport with photo;
4. Valid Government Employee photo ID (City, County, State or US Government)
5. Valid US Military photo ID
6. Tribal photo ID

A voter who does not have any of the above photo IDs may obtain a Voter Identification Card at NO COST upon providing that they are a Georgia voter, from the Franklin County Board of Elections and Registration Office or the Department of Driver Services.

11. OBSERVATION OF COUNTY: On Election Night, the public may observe the tabulation of votes at the Franklin County Board of Elections & Registration Office located at 211 Athens St, Carnesville, GA 30521; Phone: (706) 384-4390.

Note: All results on Election Night are UNOFFICIAL and include Absentee Ballots, but do not include Provisional Ballots. Absentee Ballots are counted on Election Day. Provisional Ballots are counted after 10:00am on the Friday after the Election. Unofficial Vote Totals are subject to change during the reconciliation process.

12. DISSEMINATION AND VIEW OF ELECTION RESULTS . . .
BY PHONE: Election results on Election Night can be obtained by phone (706) 384-4390. Due to the volume of calls on Election Night, election results provided by phone are limited to a maximum of 3 races or questions per caller.

IN PERSON: On Election Night, the public may observe the tabulation of votes at the Elections Office. Election results will be displayed until all votes are tallied with the exception of Provisional Votes which are tabulated the Friday after the Election.

13. VOTER'S CHECKLIST – Things to Do before Election Day

- 1. Confirm you are registered to vote several weeks before the date of the election. Update your registration information, such as address and name.**
- 2. Know how and when to apply for an Absentee Ballot if you are unable to vote in person at your polling place on Election Day or during the Advance Voting period.**
- 3. Know the voter identification requirements before you attempt to vote.**
- 4. Know which polling place you are assigned to and how to get there.**
- 5. Familiarize yourself with the voting device used. Learn how the device is accessible to voters with disabilities.**
- 6. Learn who can assist in voting and who can receive assistance.**
- 7. Know what time the polls open and close.**
- 8. Obtain a Sample Ballot from the Elections Office to become acquainted with candidates and issues on the ballot.**
- 9. Consider becoming a poll worker.**
